

How to find your way around the Bible...


Look out for the **READ** sign.

...this means chapter 20 and verse 30
...and this is how you find it.

- 


3 Ask God to help you to understand what you read.




Are you ready to spot your first summer signpost? Then hurry on to Day 1.

Summer Signposts will help you to find out more about what this means.






THE ONE O'CLOCK MIRACLE

THINK + PRAY


Jesus was their King

The crowds were **RIGHT** but they were **WRONG!**

He hadn't come to get rid of the Romans

Jesus the King **DID** come to rescue His people—but **NOT** by freeing them from the Romans. We'll find out more about how Jesus rescues people on Day 14.

Christians are people who follow Jesus as their King, doing what He wants them to do. Jesus is in charge.
