### Family Project: The New York Institute for Special Education (NYISE)

God made Fanny Crosby with some really amazing talents and abilities. He also made her without the ability to see, which is called "blind." Fanny attended school at the New York Institution for the Blind, now known as The New York Institute for Special Education (NYISE).
